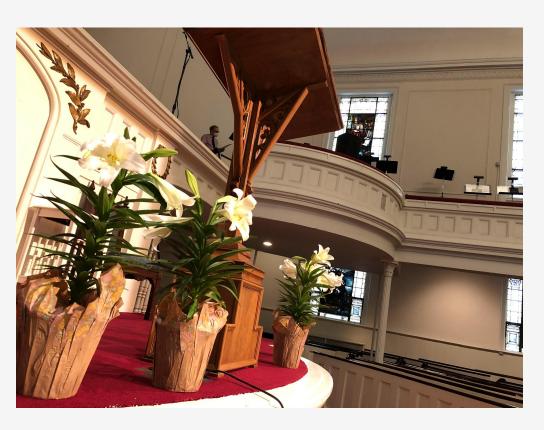

Phase 1: 75 Hicks Lobby / Gym



Why did we start here?

> Stand-alone area of the campus, not dependent on Hillis or Sanctuary upgrades

Increasing rental capability with improved bathroom / pantry facility

- Reception Room allows for catered / large events while Hillis renovation is ongoing
- Allowed **lead time** for developing further phases in Hillis and Sanctuary

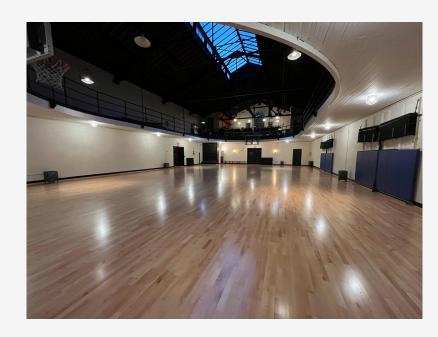




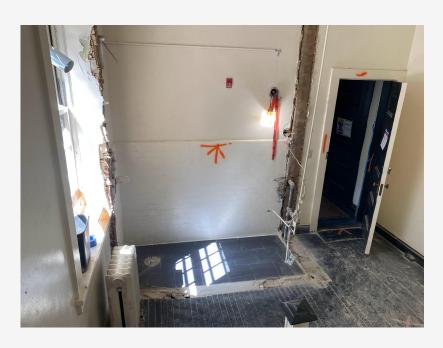

SANCTUARY + HILLIS

Assessment Highlight: Buildings are "Conjoined" in Electrical & Plumbing

56 Cranberry St. HILLIS HALL **PLUMBING** for BOTH comes from 56 Cranberry St.



ELECTRICAL for **BOTH** comes from **57 Orange St.**

SANCTUARY

57 Orange St

The electrical starts with the foundation...



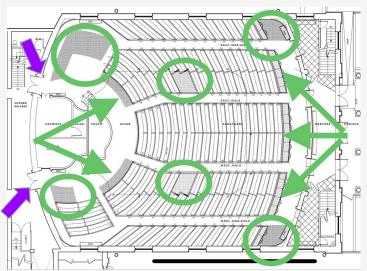
Upgraded electrical service will come through 57 Orange

To make that possible, areas of the cellar need:

- Critical **pointing** so that the foundation walls do not continue to weaken.
- **Waterproofing** select walls for electrical safety
- **Leveling** floor and laying concrete
- Restoring / waterproofing select archways and crawl spaces closest to electrical pathways



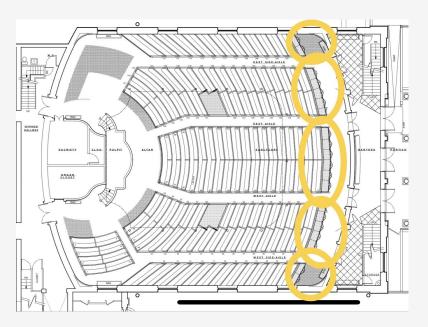
GOAL	FEATURE
Fire Prevention	Replacement of circuit breakers with safer lighting panels





GOAL	FEATURE
Improved Accessibility for welcome and hospitality of *everyone* (incl. persons who use wheelchairs and	Removal of select pews for improved egress and accessible access
their families)	Increased access in front of sanctuary for more
Increased flexibility for liturgical and musical elements in worship;	flexible and enhanced worship, including improved access to piano
	Motorized French doors at rear of Sanctuary (towards Hillis entrance) for increased accessibility

Center pew removal includes pews: #59 & #60; #129, #130 (NOT the Lincoln Pew!)
Areas with removed pews will have new carpet.



Discreet, historic-matching style **cabinetry** in rear of sanctuary

GOAL	FEATURE
Storage	Discreet cabinetry in rear of sanctuary for worship materials (hymnals, candles, collection plates, etc.)

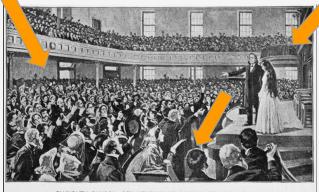

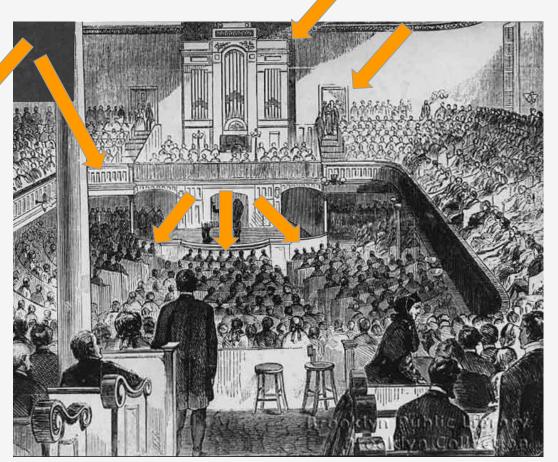

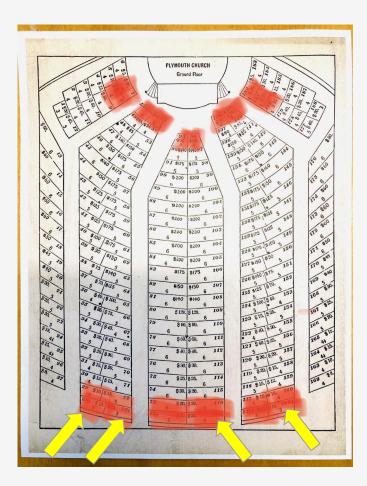

Pew Removal / Modification since 1914



REMOVED

All pews in RED were removed

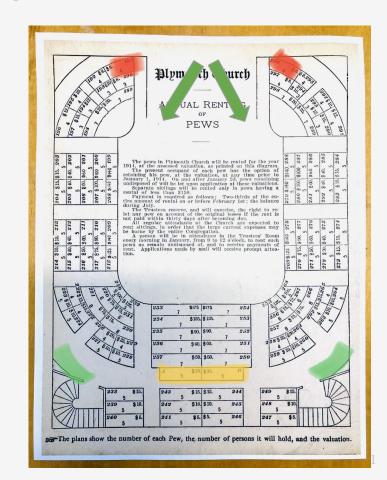
MOVED

Pews: #28 ½, #72 ½, #116 ½ and 160 ½, and were relocated to Narthex

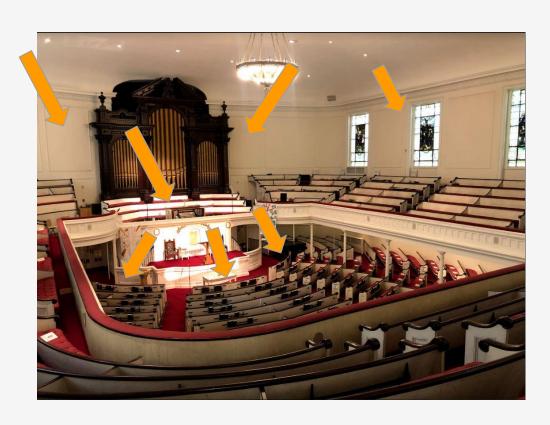
Pews A & B were moved adjacent to #243 / #244 to create egress

ADDED

Pews at east/west ends at top of stairs were added;
Choir pews added when organ was recessed



As the congregation evolved, their needs changed



And so, the sanctuary changed.

COSTS: Phase 2a (Sanctuary)

TOTAL	\$1,261,221

Current Balance (in the Bank):	\$1,766,553
Phase 2a (Sanctuary)	(less) \$1,261,221
Remaining (in the Bank) for Phase 2b (Hillis):	\$505,332

Sanctuary Wish List

Items **NOT included** in this phase (which require scaffolding):

- Fire suppression system / Additional Fireproofing: \$2M+
- Ceiling painting: \$400K
- Scaffolding: \$125K
- Sound system: \$100K
- Improved lighting system: \$160K
- Restoration of ALL pews
- Full Carpet replacement

OVERALL: there is an additional ~\$3.9M in improvements we will NOT be doing in this phase due to cost constraints.

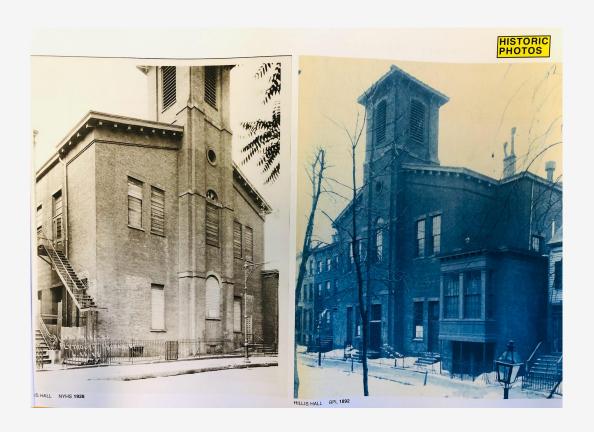
HILLIS HALL: A New Vision



- Shareability / Rentability
- More natural daylight and improved ventilation
- Direct / improved access to Playground
- > Improved kitchen

This vision for Hillis Hall involves moving and preserving the stained-glass windows.

Phase 2b: Hillis Hall After electrical, we start with the exterior



ALL interior components are contingent on reconfiguring the room and adding clear glass windows.

ALL interior **accessibility** improvements cannot happen without exterior accessibility.

In short, ALL interior improvements are dependent on:

- Resolving the perimeter
- Moving and preserving the windows
- Upgrading the foundation (electrical / plumbing)
